

WAAA Youth Baseball CONDUCT RULES

- There will be absolutely NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES consumed on the school premises. The adult and player will be told to leave the field if this rule is not adhered to.
- 2. There will be no smoking or vaping on school premises.
- 3. This league will not tolerate any yelling, profanity, or general misconduct from Managers, Coaches, Players, Parents, or Spectators. This includes public comments to an umpire. We reserve the right to ask anyone violating this code to leave the playing area. If the problem persists, please contact the Division Head or the W.A.A.A. President. This conduct may result in the child's removal from the league.
- 4. Managers and Coaches give generously of their time. Parents are asked not to abuse this. Please make arrangements so that your child is picked up on time.
- 5. Spectators are asked to refrain from coaching on the "side line." This only causes confusion for the child and could result in an injury if the child is not paying attention to the game.
- 6. Try to attend every game to support your child. Speak positively to your child about his/her performance.
- 7. For the safety of everyone, please refrain from driving on the fields. If a problem persists, you may be removed from the league.
- 8. No dogs are allowed on school premises.

Little League is an Adult Volunteer work project, constructed and supervised by parents who desire to make its benefits extend to their children. Parents must shoulder the responsibility and take the initiative to make the local program successful. Without your help the program will cease to operate.

The philosophy of the Washington Area Athletic Association is to strive to implant in the youth of our community the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, courage, leadership, loyalty and understanding. We have been providing the youth of the community with a recreational, adult supervised, and instructional baseball program since 1961.

Please familiarize yourself and your child with these rules. The aim of our league is to stress basic skills and ensure an enjoyable experience for all participants.

## **Manager Conduct Review**

## Behavior on the field

Conduct yourself in a manner that promotes teamwork, respect of others, and sportsmanship.

Comply with the rules of the division and the league's code of conduct.

Control all communications from coaches and players parents to a positive nature.

Rotate players as outlined in the rules of the division and per the player lineup/rotation sheets provided by the league.

## Escalation of Problems

Behavior of players, parents, coaches or mangers that contradict the Code of Conduct or League rules may be reviewed by the WAAA board for appropriate action. These actions may include forfeit of game, suspension of a player, coach, or manager, or removal from the league.

If you experience problems with players, parents, coaches, or managers, that cannot be resolved on the playing field, please contact the division commissioner.

Problems not resolved on the field with the opposing team manager, or after the game with the division commissioner, will be escalated to the WAAA Board for resolution. Problems that will be reviewed by the board include but are not limited to, use of profanity, use of alcohol, smoking, verbal or physical assault, improper conduct with the umpire staff, and deviation from divisional rules. When the divisional commissioner escalates a problem to the board, the President or Vice President of the league along with two other board members will review the problem. The board's decision will be the final say.

Remember, your behavior as the manager of the team sets the tone of your parents, players, and coaches. Make the game fun for all.
